PROGRAM DESCRIPTION - This program will provide children with educational opportunities to reinforce skills and extend learning. Classes are based on State Standards and will reinforce these as well as the District's curriculum. Each child (with the exception of JK and SK students) may enroll in three (3), fifty-five minute classes per day based on course availability. Please review the course offerings carefully, and select an 8:30, 9:30 and 10:30 a.m. class. Also select an alternate 8:30, 9:30 and 10:30 a.m. class that will be used if any classes are canceled due to lack of enrollment or if classes have reached full capacity. **Please note: we cannot accommodate schedule change requests after June 7, 2012.** <u>All classes will be held at Maple Dale School.</u> Classes will not meet Wednesday, July 4, 2012.

ELIGIBILITY - Any student currently enrolled in public, private or parochial elementary school having completed grades JK-7 is eligible to participate. Students must have turned 4 prior to September 1, 2011.

<u>DISTRICT STATUS</u> - A district student is any student who currently attends <u>Maple Dale-Indian Hill</u> or lives in the <u>Maple Dale-Indian Hill School District</u>. Students who attend other schools and do not live in the Maple Dale-Indian Hill School District are considered non-district residents.

PROGRAM FEES - Maple Dale-Indian Hill District Students

The cost of the summer program for resident first through seventh grade students will be \$5.00 per course selected, an additional \$45.00 for the optional kindergarten through seventh grade Friday morning program, and \$15.00 for the three hour Monday through Thursday Junior and Senior Kindergarten programs. **Additional materials fees are charged for some courses**. Please see course descriptions for any additional fees.

NON-MAPLE DALE -INDIAN HILL DISTRICT STUDENTS

The cost of the Monday-Thursday summer program for these students will be \$250 per child. Additional materials fees are charged for some courses. Please see course descriptions for any additional fees.

<u>REGISTRATION/EMERGENCY FORMS</u> - Registration should be completed by mail or dropped off at Indian Hill School, 1101 W. Brown Deer Road, Milwaukee, WI 53217 or Maple Dale School, 8377 North Port Washington Rd, Milwaukee, WI 53217. **Full payment of course fees plus any additional materials fees must be submitted with registration forms.** We are unable to prorate fees due to absence or refund fees due to withdrawal from the program. Please complete the enclosed registration/emergency forms. **(One per student.)**

All registration forms must be returned prior to 3:00 p.m. on May 10, 2012. Registrations received after this date will be handled only if class openings are available.

<u>CONFIRMATION OF COURSES AND SCHEDULE</u> - At the conclusion of the registration deadline and at least two weeks before the start of summer school, you will receive a confirmation letter with your child's schedule of his/her three (3) classes, and Friday program enrollment status if applicable. Look for your confirmation letter the first week in June.

<u>ATTENDANCE</u> - All students enrolled in the Summer Education Program are expected to attend classes on a regular basis. Advance notification of student absence should be submitted in writing to the Summer Program office, when possible.

TRANSPORTATION - No bus transportation is provided for any students to the summer program or to return home following the program. Parent carpools are strongly encouraged and have proven to be very effective to lessen traffic congestion. A traffic flow map will be sent with student registration confirmations. It is imperative that families follow these guidelines.

LATE PICK UP FEE - Due to increasing numbers of students being picked up late, a policy has been established which involves the assessment of a \$10.00 fee for each day a student is picked up later than 11:45 a.m. **This fee must be paid before the student returns for his/her next day of classes.**

SUMMER EDUCATION PROGRAM COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

The following summer school courses are available for children *presently* (as of spring 2012) in the grades indicated after each course. Please make note of any student-provided supplies and/or additional materials fees associated with some courses. Instructor assignments are tentative and are subject to change. These courses are Monday thru Thursday. Optional Friday Field Trips are on Page 8.

Junior Kindergarten

Students must have completed JK to be enrolled in this class. This three (3) hour course is a learning, social and play experience. Students will review academic skills learned in JK and will be introduced to skills presented in SK. Skills include counting, number recognition, patterns, letter recognition and formation, fine motor skills, singing and rhyming. We will also incorporate daily Spanish into the class this year.

Senior Kindergarten

Students must have completed SK to be enrolled in this course. The students in this three (3) hour course will be involved in a thematic-based program focusing on reinforcement and application of skills learned in preparation for first grade. Skills include handwriting, addition, and subtraction using manipulatives, storytelling, recognition of rhyming words and basic sight words, and stories focusing on reality and fantasy. We will also incorporate daily Spanish into the class this vear.

Introduction to Guitar: Grades 4-7 10:30 a.m.

The course "Introduction to Guitar is for children who have had no prior experience playing the guitar. The course introduces the basics of folk guitar playing including tuning, chords, strumming, and finger picking. The class will use the Hal Leonard Guitar method book that comes with a CD for home practice. Students are expected to practice at home 30-45 minutes per day and to carry a guitar to and from school. It is not possible to transport a guitar riding a bicycle. Guitars are available for those who do not own their own. It is not recommended that students begin on electric guitars. Students who have taken the class before are welcome to take it again for review; however, keep in mind that the same material will be covered Materials fee: \$10.00

Introduction to Piano: Grades 1-7 8:30 a.m.

The course "Introduction to Piano" is for children who have had no experience playing piano. The course introduces the basics of the keyboard layout, proper fingering, note letter names and time values. Using the Alfred book series, children learn simple piano pieces using one and two hands. The series guides the children through basic music theory and fingering technique. Books are included in the material fee. The students must provide headphones. Children should practice 20-30 minutes per day on a home keyboard or piano.
